Asian Aerospace 2011

HEADED TO BE AMONGST THE TOP THREE AVIATION INDUSTRY EVENTS IN THE WORLD

Leveraging on the success of the past 27 years, plus the continuing shift of global economic power and influence to Asia and in particular China, Asian Aerospace is headed to be amongst the top three aviation industry events in the world. The dramatic growth of China's air carriers and the government's strategic commitment to re-developing an aerospace industry with wide ranging capabilities represents an almost unimaginable level of business opportunity for western companies seeking growth. Asian Aerospace is uniquely placed for serious "East meets West" dialogue amongst industry leaders due to its location in Hong Kong the "gateway to China".

The status of Asian Aerospace as the region's premier commercial aviation event was demonstrated with the number of VIP delegates up more than 130% over the previous show and the number of Chinese delegations also up over 50%. 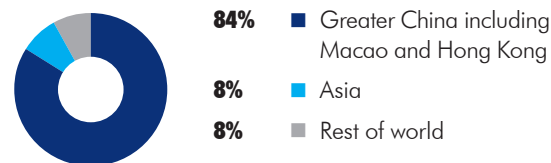

ATTENDEES BY COUNTRY

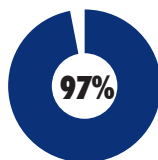

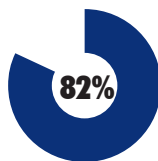

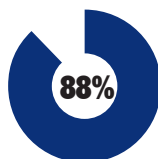
